<u>A. Administration</u>	
Board Member for 1-year in good standing	4.0
Team Manager	6.0
Team Assistant Coach (max 2 per team), Farm and above	6.0
Team Safety Officer, including completion of safety training - must have per team, farm & up	1.5
Team Parent, including completing of team parent orientation - must have per team, farm & up	1.5
Team field prep crew, at least sign up for 4 games of the season (Team Parent to manage sign up and send to Volunteer Coordinator)	1.5
Teeball - field & equipment set up for each Saturday clinic	1.0
<u>B. Snack Shack</u>	
Snack Shack Shift Supervisor for the season (3-4 spots)	3.0
Each Snack Shack shift (regular or post-season, opening or closing day) - include hanging up sponsor banners	1.0
Each subsequent Snack Shack shift after the first two	1.5
<u>C. Umpiring</u>	
Umpire first game (adult umpire or youth umpire for community service)	2.0
Umpire subsequent games, per game (adult umpire or youth umpire for community service)	1.0
Game Coordinator for a game - needed if both umpires are youth	0.5
<u>D. Other</u>	
Attend field prep training on March 2 at Wilson - must have at least 1 per team, farm & up	0.5
1 hour of field maintenance (e.g. weeding, repairing cage nets, cleaning the fields/equipment rooms/sheds, and mound rebuild, etc)	0.5
1 hour of ceremony prep for Opening Day or Closing Day	0.5
<u>E. Postseason Roles</u>	
Postseason Scorekeeper, Pitch Counter, or Scoreboard Operator - per game	1.0
Postseason Field Prep or Field Clean-up, per game	0.5
Postseason Game Announcer	0.5
Postseason Tournament Director, per game	2.0
* Each registered family is required to submit a \$300 deposit check to complete registration for their player(s) - one per family	
* Deposit checks will be returned/torn upon completing volunteer requirements	
* Families may opt out of volunteering by paying \$300 during registration, in addition to the standard registration fee	
* The League prefers volunteering to opt-out but will provide the option	
* Each registered family is required to complete 6 credits throughout the season	
* Each registered family is encouraged to volunteer for 2 shifts at the Snack Shack	
* CLL is all volunteer-run, please consider contributing more than 6 credits if you can	
* Families who have not reached the requirement will receive an email reminder from Volunteer Coordinator shortly after Spring Break	
* Families who have not reached the requirement by the end of the season will have their deposit check cashed	
* There will be separate signups for the above positions starting in February 2024 and throughout the season	
* Fulfillment of volunteer requirements will be tracked by the Volunteer Coordinator

<u>Snack Shack</u>	
Snack Shack Shift Supervisor	Need one supervisor per shift - in charge of opening (cleaning, prepping food/stations, organizing the cash box, etc.), making sure someone can manage the iPad and fill orders, and closing (cleaning, securing the cash, inventory, etc.). Shift volunteers will help with opening/closing under the guidance of the shift supervisor. Snack Shack Coordinator from the Board will provide training if needed. All Shift Supervisors to split the shifts of the season. Each Shift Supervisor is expected to supervise multiple shifts.
Each Snack Shack shift	Each shift including opening and closing is no more than 4 hours. Shift Supervisor will provide guidance. Look out for information to sign up on Signup Genius.
<u>Umpiring</u>	
Adult Umpire	Adults who volunteer as umpires for Minors and Majors games.
Youth Umpire	Youth 12 years old and over to umpire Minors (and Majors, if the umpire is experienced) games. Youth umpires are paid positions (\$30 for base umpire, \$40 for plate umpire), or can be unpaid to fulfill high school volunteer requirements. Unpaid youth umpires will also count towards family's required volunteer credits for the season. Youth umpires do not need to be current baseball players.
Game Coordinator	Adults to represent Youth Umpires at a game there there is no adult umpires. This role is mainly to support the youth umpires should issues occur during the game.
Umpire Training	All these three positions above have to complete the Umpire Training around early March 2023 (Rules Clinic via Zoom and Mechanics Clinic at Wilson Park). Please email umpires@cupertinolittleleague.org for more information if you are interested.
<u>Postseason Roles</u>	
Tournament Director	Check paperwork of the playing teams. Welcome and announcing ground rules, umpiring crew and playing teams. Signing off final score and pitch count post game. Writing and submitting post-game summary to District 44.
Game Announcer	Announce each player as they come to bat, pitching change, and score at each half inning.
Field Set-Up/Prep	Home team is responsible for uncovering field, putting bases in and dragging/watering the infield dirt and plate area as well as painting home plate and foul lines. Bringing out scoreboard operator table and keyboard. Field Break-Down/Clean-Up	Home team is esponsible for putting away bases, dragging field and tarping.
Scoreboard	The home team is responsible for operating the digital scoreboard.
Scorekeeper on GameChanger	On the GameChanger app to mark the plays of the game which translate into official score/record of the game.
Pitch Count	Responsible for keeping track of the number of pitches thrown by the pitchers and communicating that to the coaches as there are different pitch count limitations based on age.
