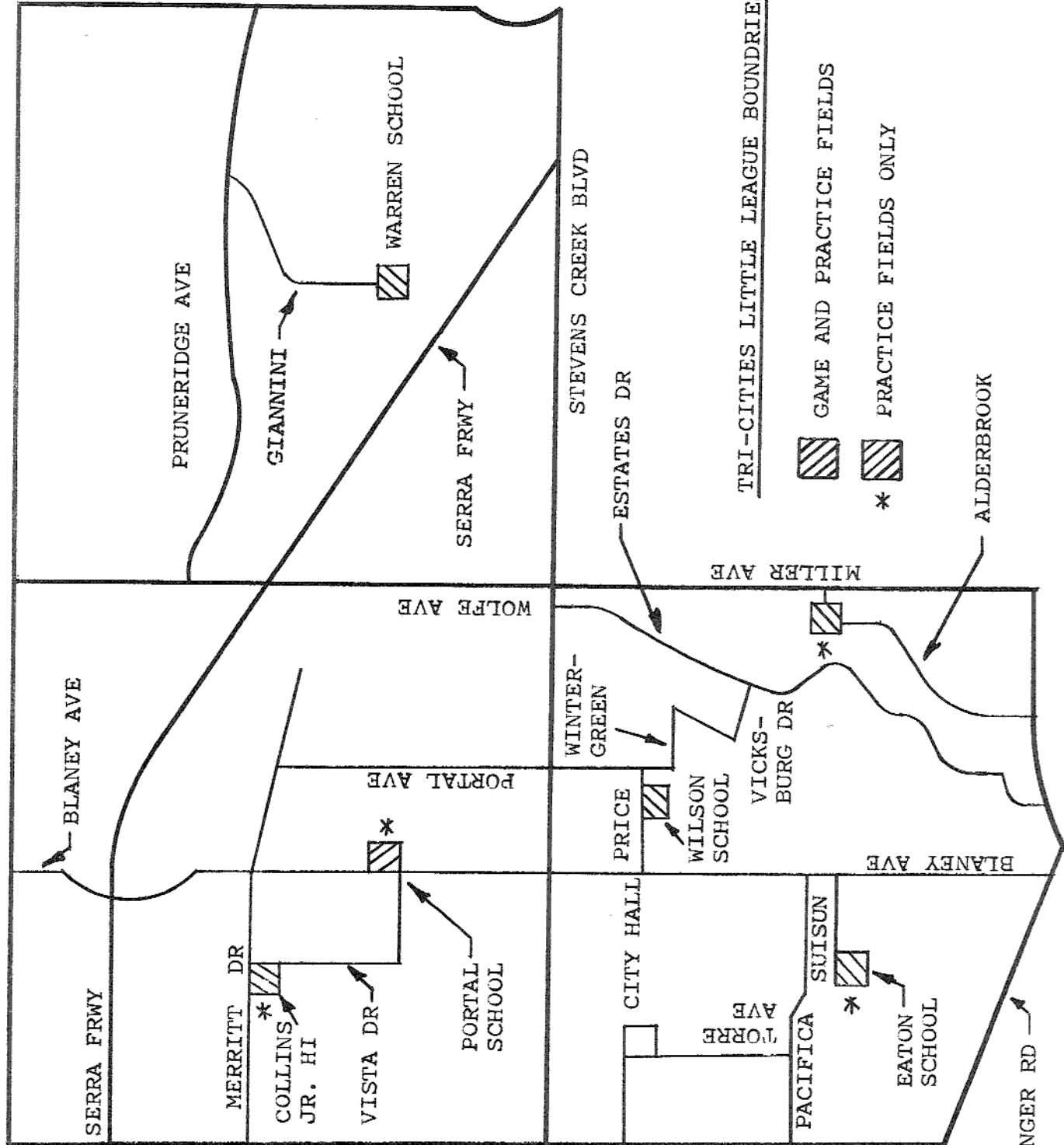

TRI-CITIES LITTLE LEAGUE AND SENIOR LEAGUE RULES

Rules as defined in the 1973 Official Little League Baseball Rules or 1973 Senior League Rules and Regulations shall apply to Tri-Cities Senior, Senior Minor, Major, National and American league play with the additions and exceptions listed on the following pages.

Any violations of these rules may lead to suspension of the manager, coach or player or forfeiture of the game(s) involved.

These Rules have been approved by TCLL Board of Directors.


The Rules were written to protect managers/coaches/teams/players and to clarify or fill the gaps in the Little League and Senior League Rule Books, as well as to cover TCLL Operating Procedures.

Because a manager didn't read or understand a rule, doesn't take away from its enforcement. It is recommended that every manager reads these rules and get a clarification on those he doesn't understand from his league director. It is also recommended that his coach also reads and understands these rules.

These rules only apply to local (TCLL) League games. Tournament games will be governed by separate tournament rules.

No rule can be changed without the approval of TCLL Board of Directors

These rules have been submitted to District 44, and to Williamsport.

SECTION 1. TRYOUTS

1. Prior to tryouts, the Player Agent shall make a list showing the names and league age of each candidate (except 8-yr-olds who are not eligible for Major or National League drafts). The Player Agents List will be provided to each manager at the beginning of tryouts.
2. The candidates will be scheduled by the Player Agent to appear at the tryout field prior to their tryout time, to provide for a warmup session under the supervision of a league official.
3. During tryouts each boy will be given the opportunity to bat, field, throw and run in competition with boys having the same league age. Eight year olds will not tryout because they will be assigned to teams in the American League by locality.
4. Each manager shall grade the candidates on the Player Agents List for his own reference (to be used for drafts), except for the American League managers who will be assigned teams by the Player Agent.

SECTION 2. PLAYER SELECTION (DRAFTS)

1. GENERAL

- A. Managers may submit options on brothers who are subject to drafts. When first brother is drafted and an option has been submitted, the manager automatically takes brother on the next turn. A manager may also submit an option on a draftee if the boy's brother is a member of the team he manages. This option must be exercised within the first three draft selections.
- B. A manager who has a son(s) eligible for the draft who wishes to draft him (or them) for his team must state so in writing to the Player Agent one (1) week prior to the draft. If so stated the manager is required to exercise his option prior to the close of specific draft rounds depending on the boy(s) league age, as follows:

Little League Age	Senior League Age	Draft Round
10	13	5
11	14	4
12	15	3

If the manager so chooses, he may waive the option to his son(s).

2. Major League Drafts

- A. Subsequent to the tryouts Major League Teams will draft in reverse order of previous years team standings, in each draft round.
Example: Last place team will draft first in each draft round.
Note: If the number of Major league teams should change the Board of Directors will meet to decide the best method to change and the resultant draft systems.
- B. A maximum of seven 12-yr-olds and a minimum of two 10-yr-olds will comprise the team rosters. No 8 or 9-yr-olds will be drafted to the Majors. The minimum team roster is thirteen Regulation III (C).
- C. Each manager requiring seven (7) or more players prior to the draft to complete his roster, will be allowed one bonus pick at the completion of round four (4). Additional bonus picks will be permitted at the completion of each round thereafter until team rosters are balanced.
- D. Players shall not be told the order in which they were drafted.
- E. 10, 11, and 12-yr-olds are eligible for the Major League drafts provided they participated in tryouts.

3. National League Drafts

- A. Subsequent to the Major League Drafts the National League Drafts will be held.

SECTION 2. PLAYER SELECTION (DRAFTS) continued

3. National League Drafts (continued)

- B. Managers will draw for drafting order.
- C. Order of Draft:
 - 1st round-----Team 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9 then 10
 - 2nd round-----Team 10,9,8,7,6,5,4,3,2, then 1
 - 3rd round-----Team 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9 then 10
 - 4th round & up-ect.
- D. 9-yr-olds and remaining 10,11, and 12-yr-olds are eligible for the National League drafts. 8-yr-olds will not be drafted to the National League.
- E. 12-yr-olds may not pitch in the National League.Regulation VI.
- F. All remaining 12-yr-olds will be drafted into the National League unless there is a medical reason for limiting a boy or boys to the American League. The Player Agent will make the determination and will record such action and reason on the boys signup card.
- G. A boy having once played in the National League shall not be returned to the American League except by parental consent.
- H. The minimum team roster is thirteen (13) players.
- I. The managers option will be granted provided a written request is submitted to the Player Agent one (1) week prior to the Major League Drafts.
- J. Players shall not be told in what order they were drafted.

4. American League Assignments

- A. All boys not drafted by the Major and National Leagues will be divided up by locality and league age as evenly as possible, by the Player Agent, and assigned to teams.
- B. The Player Agent will assign each manager a team.
- C. The minimum team rosters shall be thirteen (13).
- D. The managers option will be granted provided a written request is submitted to the Player Agent one (1) week prior to the Major League Drafts.

5. Senior League Drafts

- A. Subsequent to the tryouts Senior Major League teams will draft in reverse order of previous years team standings, in each draft round.
 - Example: Last place team will draft first in each draft round.

TRI-CITIES LITTLE LEAGUE AND SENIOR LEAGUE RULES

5. Senior League Drafts (continued)

Note: If the number of Senior Major League teams should change the Board of Directors will meet to decide the best method to change and the resultant draft system.

- B. A maximum of six 15-yr-olds and a minimum of three or four 13-yr-olds (depending on team rosters of 13, 14 or 15 players) will comprise the team rosters. Regulation III C.
- C. Each manager requiring seven (7) or more players prior to the draft to complete his roster, will be allowed one bonus pick at the completion of round (4). Additional bonus picks will be permitted at the completion of each round thereafter until team rosters are balanced.
- D. Players shall not be told the order in which they were drafted.
- E. 13, 14, and 15-yr-olds are eligible for the Senior League drafts provided they participated in tryouts.

6. Senior Minor League Drafts

- A. Subsequent to the Senior League Drafts the Senior Minor League drafts will be held.
- B. Managers will draw for drafting order.
- C. Order of Draft:
 - 1st round-----teams 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9, then 10
 - 2nd round-----teams 10,9,8,7,6,5,4,3,2, then 1
 - 3rd round-----teams 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9, then 10
 - 4th round & up, ect.
- D. Remaining 13, 14, and 15-yr-olds will be drafted into the Senior Minors.
- E. 15-yr-olds may not pitch in the Senior Minors. Regulation XII D
- F. The minimum team roster is thirteen (13) players.
- G. The managers option will be granted provided a written request is submitted to the Player Agent one (1) week prior to the Senior League drafts.
- H. Players shall not be told the order in which they were drafted.

TRI-CITIES LITTLE LEAGUE AND SENIOR LEAGUE RULES

SECTION 3. Manager/Player Agent/Player Interface

1. A manager shall notify the Player Agent within 24 hours either by phone, in person, or a note in the mail box upon learning of a permanent loss of a player on his team roster. He shall also report this to his league Director.
2. After opening day a manager shall notify the Player Agent when any boy misses three (3) consecutive games with or without authorized excuse. He shall also report this to his league Director.
3. Managers are required to bring their rosters to the player limit (minimum roster) within five (5) days after the permanent loss of a player. A player on vacation is to be considered as active. If circumstances warrant, the Player Agent shall have the right to extend the five day period or immediately assign a player of his choice to the team in question.
4. No twelve (12) year old boy is allowed to play in the American League except for medical reasons.
5. No boy who is less than ten years of Little League age shall be permitted to play on a Major League team.
6. A boy having once played in the National League shall not be returned to the American League except by parental consent.
7. Any player drafted to a Senior or Major League team during the last five (5) games of the season must be the same age or older than the player he replaces.
8. After a Senior Minor, National or American League team has had a player drafted to a higher division, no other player may be drafted from that team until at least five other teams (in the Senior Minors all the other teams) in that division has had a player drafted, unless agreed to by the affected manager and Player Agent, and applicable League Director.
9. All drafting transactions must be through the Player Agent. If any player is contacted for selection to a higher division before the Player Agent and applicable League Director is notified, the team may not receive the player in question. The Player Agent shall notify the boy after approving the transaction. If any problems arise the applicable League Directors shall be notified to help bring timely resolutions.
10. Following the draft, managers may, if they desire, exchange players within the same division until fourteen (14) days after the first scheduled game. All exchanges shall be made with the approval of the Player Agent. The Player Agent shall notify the players involved, and the League Director shall be notified.

TRI-CITIES LITTLE LEAGUE AND SENIOR LEAGUE RULES

SECTION 3. Manager/Player Agent/Player Interface (continued)

11. A player drafted to a higher division will report to the higher division team, the day after the next scheduled game of the team he is leaving.
12. A Manager may have a coach or multiple coaches: However, only one coach will be officially recognized as "the coach", and will be listed on the team roster.
13. In the event of an emergency (one game only), the manager may appoint any legal adult to represent him if both he and the approved coach(s) are to be absent from a game.

Note: Managers are appointed by the League President and approved by the Board of Directors. Coaches are also approved by the Board of Directors; Therefore, any acting manager other than the approved coach(s) must also be approved by the President, Player Agent or League Director within 24 hours after the game.

If any further absences by the manager and coach are anticipated then a new manager or coach will have to be appointed and approved by the Board of Directors.

14. The manager must report any boy to the Player Agent who misses 50% of his team practice sessions subsequent to the draft and prior to opening day. A boy who misses 50% of his teams practice sessions during this period, shall forfeit his eligibility to play Little League (or Senior League) baseball, unless he presents an excuse which is accepted by a majority of the team managers from the league in which he was drafted.
15. In the event of a tie for first place in either the 1st or 2nd half of the playing season, a winner will be selected based on comparing the won/lost records between the teams involved. If a winner cannot be selected by the aboved, a winner will be selected by comparing total runs scored between the teams involved. If a clear winner cannot be selected, the Player Agent will schedule a playoff game(s).
16. A playoff game will be scheduled by the Player Agent, between 1st and 2nd half winners to determine league championship if necessary. Regulation VII (F).
17. Playoffs for 2nd and 3rd place ties will not be played. League standings will be determined as follows:
 - A. If playoff between 1st and 2nd half winners;
 - 1st Place----winner of Playoff game.
 - 2nd Place----loser of Playoff game.
 - 3rd Place----best total record (1st & 2nd half) of remaining teams.
 - 4th Place & up----ect.

SECTION 3. Manager/Player Agent/Player Interface (continued)

Note: In case of a tie for 3rd place both teams will receive trophies.

- B. If no playoff game (same team wins 1st & 2nd half)
1st Place----winner of 1st & 2nd half.
2nd Place----best total record (1st & 2nd half)
 of remaining teams.
3rd Place----& up, ect.

Note: 1. In case of a tie for 2nd place both teams will receive 2nd place trophies. 3rd place trophies will not be awarded in this case.

2. In case of a tie for 3rd place both teams will receive trophies provided there is not a tie for 2nd place (see note above)

18. A manager who is filling a vacancy on his teams roster may choose from either the lower league or the Player Agents waiting list, providing that a boy selected from the Player Agents waiting list has been on that list a minimum of two (2) weeks.

SECTION 4. Pregame Rules

1. The home team takes the third (3rd) base dugout.
2. The home team will bring out the umpire equipment and prepare the field for play: chalking, placing bases, setout pylons, raking baselines, etc.
3. Five (5) minutes before the game begins both managers (or acting managers) must:
 1. submit 3 copies of their batting line-up to their scorekeeper, providing pitcher eligibility (rule 5.02) and status of absent & disciplined players.

Note: The home team scorekeeper is the official scorekeeper for the game.

2. Meet with umpire(s) to go over ground rules (rule 5.02)
3. Supply umpire with game balls. (rule 5.01)

Note: Each Senior League manager will provide one new game ball.

Each Major, National, American League Manager will provide :

- a. home team one new game ball
 - b. visiting team one good used ball.
4. All managers shall use the batting order forms provided to designate roster status and pitcher eligibility.
 5. Managers will agree prior to the start of a game, on any umpire(s) unless the scheduled umpire(s) is/are present

TRI-CITIES LITTLE LEAGUE AND SENIOR LEAGUE RULES

SECTION 4. Pregame Rules (continued)

6. The visiting team shall have availability of the field for practice thirty (30) to fifteen (15) minutes before game time. The home team will take the field for practice fifteen(15) to zero (0) minutes before game time.
7. Umpires will check with each team to insure catchers are wearing cups. (rule 5.01A)
8. In the event the home teams scorekeeper is absent the home team manager may delegate to the visiting team's scorekeeper the duty of official scorekeeper.

SECTION 5. Game Rules

1. A manager shall have ten (10) minutes from the scheduled starting time of a game and after the umpire has announced "PLAY BALL" to field nine eligible uniformed players. Failure to do so shall mean forfeiture of the game.(rule 5.06)
2. If an umpire determines that a player is guilty of unnecessary roughness or intentional throwing of a bat or helmet during a game, he may eject the player for the remainder of the game. The manager has no recourse.
3. Any fair fly ball which passes over the outfield markers or fence whether or not it has been touched by a fielder shall be declared a home run. (rule 7.17D)
4. Any fair ball which passes the outfield markers (in fair or foul territory) after having first (1st) touched the ground in fair territory, will be declared an automatic double. the ball is dead and all runners advance two (2) bases from where they were when the ball was pitched.(rule 7.17D)
5. Every player in the Senior Minors, Major, National and American Leagues shall play a minimum of three innings per game or a minimum of two innings and must bat. The only deviation from this rule may be for safety reasons, disciplinary reasons, or playing of a league championship game.

- Notes:
1. Protests involving this rule have to be submitted in writing within twenty-four (24) hours to the League President. The protest does not have to be submitted to the umpire for this rule.
 2. For the purpose of this rule the definition of an inning as defined by the "Little League Baseball Official Rules" and "Senior League Rules and Regulations" SHALL APPLY. Please read rule definition 4.42.

TRI-CITIES LITTLE LEAGUE AND SENIOR LEAGUE RULES

SECTION 5. Game Rules (continued)

3. Any boy inserted into the lineup (for the first time) at the top of the 5th inning, Seniors 6th inning, will be considered as playing two full innings and a boy inserted into the lineup at the top of the 4th inning, Seniors 5th inning, will be considered as playing three full innings even though the home team wins at the top of the 6th, Seniors 7th. However a boy only playing two innings must come to bat.
4. A boy inserted in the lineup (for the first time) at the top of the 5th inning, Seniors 6th inning, had better be played where he will come to bat, even if the home team wins in the top of the 6th inning, Seniors 7th.
5. A violation of this rule will mean automatic forfeiture of the game in which the violation occurs, provided conditions in note 1 have been met.
6. Players shall not wear short pants or cutoffs during games.
7. The use of tobacco, alcoholic beverages and/or profanity on the playing field, benches or dugouts is prohibited.
8. If the umpire declares a game forfeit he shall sign the scorekeeper(s) book stating why, and submit a written report to the Chief Umpire, Player Agent, League Director or League President within twenty-four (24) hours.
9. Players may not approach manager/umpire discussions unless instructed to do so by the manager and umpire.
10. Scorebooks must show precise time of substitutions.

Example: B-2-1 will indicate the player entered the game in the bottom of the 2nd inning, with one (1) out already played.
11. No new inning shall start one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) hour prior to next scheduled game. *(See sheet 13 for continuation of rule)
12. Only the manager may act on the teams behalf or be on the playing field during the game.
13. In the absence of the manager, the "recognized coach" (see section 3, rule 12) becomes the manager for the period of the scheduled game or until the manager arrives.
14. In the event of an emergency (one game only) where both the manager and coach will be absent, see section 3, rule 13

TRI-CITIES LITTLE LEAGUE AND SENIOR LEAGUE RULES

SECTION 5. Game Rules (continued)

15. Uniformed players, manager, coaches and umpires only shall be permitted within the confines of the playing field just prior to and during games. Bat boys must be eligible team players, and scorekeepers are not allowed in the dugouts. (regulation XIV -B)
16. Managers and coaches must remain in the dugout during process of games except for the following conditions:
 1. Timeout
 2. Giving substitutions to scorekeepers
 3. Between innings
17. Managers and players must request timeout from the umpire, and not assume it or call it themselves. Only the umpire can call timeout after all legal play has ended.
18. The pitcher from either the windup or set position shall assume a stance with his pivot foot on top of, or in front of and in contact with the pitching plate, but not off the end of the pitcher's plate. He shall maintain contact as he pivots and begins his pitching motion. He shall not raise either foot except that in actual delivery of the ball to the batter, he may take one step backward and one step forward with his free foot. (Little League Rule 4.74 and Senior League Rule 8.04)
19. Outfield boundaries from home plate:

Senior League -----	300 feet (recommended)
Senior Minors-----	250 feet (recommended)
Major League-----	200 feet (maximum)
National League-----	165 feet (maximum)
American League-----	150 feet (maximum)
20. 12-yr-olds may not pitch in the National League and 15-yr-olds may not pitch in the Senior Minors.
21. Special American League Rules
 - A. The batting tee shall be used for the 1st four league games.
 - B. Each team will be furnished with a practice tee, to be used only during practice. Official game tees will be kept in the concession stand and will be the only tee used for scheduled League games.
 - C. All games after the 1st four league games will be with a pitched ball (by a team player).
 - D. No eleven (11) year old player may pitch in the American League.

TRI-CITIES LITTLE LEAGUE AND SENIOR LEAGUE RULES

SECTION 5. Special American League Rules (continued)

- E. No pitcher is to pitch more than three (3) innings per game, or a maximum of six (6) innings per week.
- F. The strike zone is that space over home plate which is between the batters chin and the top of his knees when he assumes his natural batting stance
- G. When a game is played with a tee or with a pitched ball, an inning will end when one of the following conditions have been met:
1. When three (3) outs have been made.
 2. When nine (9) batters have completed their turn at bat in one inning.
 3. After the ninth (9th) batter hits a fair ball with less than two (2) outs, the inning shall end when the ball is thrown to the catcher (or is fielded by a defensive player) who in turn steps on home plate.
- H. The ninth (9th) batter shall not be intentionally walked.
- I. The balk rule is not in effect.
- J. The infield fly rule is not in effect.
- K. No new inning shall start after 8:30PM.
- L. A player may not steal home unless one of the following conditions occur:
1. A play is made by a member of the defensive team on any baserunner.
 2. The pitcher fails to catch the ball returned from the catcher or another fielder.
- M. No more than a ten (10) foot lead may be taken from third base after a pitched ball reaches the plate.
Penalty: In the event a play is made on the runner who is attempting to steal home and he is put out, the out stands.
- In the event a play is made on the runner who is attempting to steal home and he is safe at home plate, he will be returned to third base and the run will not count.
- N. A motion or a "fake" by a member of the defensive team shall not be considered a play and the offensive runner may not legally steal home.

TRI-CITIES LITTLE LEAGUE AND SENIOR LEAGUE RULES

SECTION 5. Special American League Rules (continued)

- O. Adults should be used as first and third base coaches (or managers or coaches who are not of legal adult age provided they have been approved by the Board of Directors).
- P. Each play will end when the ball is returned to the pitcher, who must be standing on the pitcher's mound. (umpire's judgement)

Note: The mound is normally a 10 foot diameter dirt circle around the pitcher's rubber. A circle may be chalked if required.

- Q. Before each game the managers and umpires will determine the boundaries. When an overthrow goes past the specify boundary line the runner will get one (1) extra base plus the base he was going to. If the ball (overthrown) remains in bounds the ball is in play and the baserunner can take as many bases as he can.
- R. Bunting off the tee is not permitted. Otherwise alright.

SECTION 6. POST GAME AND MISC. RULES

- 1. Home team shall return all equipment to storage area after game. Put away neatly.
- 2. Home team managers shall remain until concession stand is closed and concession workers are ready to leave.
- 3. Visiting team shall clean the playing area and surrounding area after the game, and before going to the concession stand, or leaving for home.
 - Note: We are guests at the playing fields (schools). Lets keep in good standing with the schools and not lose our use of the fields.
- 4. Razzing or heckling of opponents is against the spirit of Little League and is not permitted.
- 5. The only reason for rescheduling a game shall be due to weather or field availability/conditions and the umpire shall make the decision on calling the game. Games will not be rescheduled because the manager, coach and/or key players cannot be in attendance. Games will not be rescheduled if a manager cannot field a team.
- 6. Painting or altering of playing equipment or uniforms (except for necessary repair) in any way is not permitted.

SECTION 6. POST GAME AND MISC. RULES (continued)

7. A manager or coach shall not berate any umpire or player publicly to his team or any team of any division, and shall not condone such actions from players on his team.
8. Managers and coaches shall refrain from severely lecturing the players publicly.
9. League championship games (between 1st and 2nd half winners) shall be scheduled so that each team has full use of all their active pitchers. Exception: Players on vacation shall not be considered active for this rule.
10. The League Director will be notified (by the winning team) of the outcome of each game by the publicity form. This form will be due to him at the end of the week (Sunday) in which the games were played. He will group and forward to the publicity chairman for local newspaper coverage. He will also maintain a standing sheet (current within a week) for the newsletter (Dug-Out-Data) editor. The League Director's standing sheet will be the official standing report.

Note: It is the wish of TCLL Board of Directors that each winning manager submit this form covering his team as well as the losers, mentioning as many boys as possible. Try to mention your under achievers when you can for your outstanding players will be appearing in the write-ups frequently.

11. Major League managers will (home team) water the Wilson Field while the concession stand is closing. Water valve key is available in the concession stand.
12. Umpire-in-chief shall sign official scorekeepers book at the conclusion of the game.

** (Continuation of rule 11 page 9)

Games not completed shall be terminated or suspended by the umpire and declared either a regulation game or a regulation drawn game as determined by rule 6.13 or 6.14 in the "Little League Baseball Official Rules" or 6.19 or 6.20 under the "Senior League Rules and Regulations".

- C. Boys who fail to participate in tryouts are ineligible for selection to certain leagues depending on their Little League age, as follows:

12	Major
11	American/Major
10	Major

*Must go on the Player Agents waiting list for opening, only on a senior major league team, subsequent to team drafts.

- D. Returning Major and Senior Major League players who sign up subsequent to the drafts will forfeit their rights to remain on their former team roster, and will be assigned to the Player Agents waiting list.
- E. Boys being selected under the Managers Option do not have to participate in tryouts to be eligible to be selected in the league in which their parent is managing.

SECTION 3. Manager/Player Agent/Player Interface

2. (add note)

A Senior League Player who is on a high school baseball team is excused from participating in Senior League baseball until the high school season is completed.
